Updates, events, and recommended reading from Women Transforming Cities.



A big welcome to all of our new members who joined us last month during our membership drive!

As the year comes to a close, we've been reflecting on the areas in 2023 that we took action in:

- **Budget advocacy:** collaborated with 14 organizations on a letter to City Council and spoke in person to urge them to reinvest in equity in their 2023 operational budget by funding the programs and initiatives that provide resources to marginalized populations.
- Civic engagement: Ensured Council was aware of accessibility and equity impacts of proposed changes to the way residents engage with Council meetings (such as the length of time someone can speak for) and ensured our community was aware of the changes.
- **Transit:** Urged councillors to endorse the Transit for Teens campaign which would extend free transit from youth aged 0-12 to all youth 0-18.
- Climate action: Joined the Climate Response Team hosted by Little Mountain Neighbourhood House to prevent the death of older adults in

extreme heat events in the neighbourhood.

- Neighbourhood Equity: Supported a motion to Reinvest in South Vancouver
- Democratic Rights: Mobilized around council's actions to <u>silence non</u> <u>profit organizations</u> who receive City funding
- Housing: advocated to council to pass a motion similar to the HPPC
 commitment to reduce barriers to non-market housing and took action on
 the return of \$3.8 million from the Empty Homes Tax revenue for social
 housing projects to developers
- DTES: WTC board <u>published an op-ed in The Province</u> about the violent removal of DTES residents

We couldn't do this without you. Your membership, your support, and the collaboration of values-aligned organizations drive our advocacy forward.

Next year, we just keep going.

TELL COUNCIL

DO INVEST IN:

- Social services that residents rely on things like community centres, libraries, social grants, warming centres, and drop-in centres
- · Equity things like the equity office, MMIWG and gender equity, accessibility, and democratic engagement
- Resilience things like climate action and heat preparedness

DON'T:

- Cut services that those struggling most rely on
- Increase costs for recreation programs during a cost-of-living crisis
- Burn out city staff by under-resourcing their work
- Increase funding to the VPD
