

# CITY OF PORT MOODY

## Public Delegations

- You may request to appear as a delegation, meaning to present to council, if you wish to speak at a live council meeting. See the [Council Meetings webpage](#) for information.
- Individuals or groups must submit a [Delegation Request Form](#) to City Hall by **9:30 am** at least 8 days before the meeting they wish to speak at.
- Council will hear 1 delegation per meeting. Speakers have **5 minutes** to present.



## Speaking on a Member Motion

- There are no instructions specific to addressing a member motion at a council meeting currently available. Refer to appearing as a delegate or speaking to council during public input periods.



## Community Advisory Committees

- There are committees, commissions, and boards with different combinations of community members, council members, and city staff. See the [Committees, Commissions and Boards webpage](#) for information.
- List of committees, commissions, and boards: Advisory Design Panel; Arts, Culture, and Heritage Committee; Board of Variance; City Initiatives Planning Committee; Climate Action Committee; Economic Development and Tourism Committee; Finance Committee; Governance and Legislation Committee; Inclusion, Diversity, Equity, and Accessibility (IDEA) Committee; Land Use Committee; Library Board; Mayor's Arts and Business Coalition Task Force; Parks and Environment Committee; Seniors Focus Committee; Strategic Priorities Committee; Transportation Committee; Youth Focus Committee.
- Most committees have a 2-year term with a 2-term limit. Terms of reference may vary from committee to committee.
