We know that navigating these systems and processes are challenging. So, we are trying to make it a little easier!

Last month, we shared our new <u>civic resources</u> to support the participation of Vancouver residents. This month, we're launching a set of <u>engagement guides for 10 communities across BC</u> - from our neighbours in Richmond and Burnaby all the way to Powell River.

These resources are intended to be direct and straightforward. They explain in plain language your opportunities to participate in your local government. We hope to continue to develop more, so let us know if you'd like one for your municipality!

- Moderated the panel What Can Local Governments Do to Prepare for Extreme Heat at the Columbia Institute's High Ground 2024 and shared ideas to protect our seniors, tenants, and disabled community from extreme heat





Understanding Local Government with a Focus on: Food Justice


If you missed our February learning series, here's your chance to learn all about local government! This workshop will cover
